## Playboy Magazine To Stop Nude Photos

### Playboy will end pornography in 2016

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**USPA NEWS** - Playboy Magazine announced on Tuesday (Oct. 13) that it will stop publishing full pornographic photographs in 2016, according to magazine executives. The change will begin as of their March 2016 issue, and will still contain photographs of women, but none of which will be pornographic.

### Big Changes

On Tuesday (Oct. 13), Playboy Magazine executives announced that as of their March 2016 issue, Playboy Magazine will no longer depict fully nude photographs of their models, showing instead models in questionable clothing (most likely to be non-nude but yet still risky clothing, such as thin panties and thin bras). The announcement was announced after profits were down over the past several years, going from several million subscribers in the 1980s, to only 800,000 subscribers in 2014 (SOURCE: Fox News Business). The belief on why sales are down are for two reasons: one, most of its target audience have jobs, where it would be considered "not safe for work," and that pretty much everything found on its pages can be found on Google.

### History

Playboy Magazine was founded in 1953 by Hugh Hefner. Its first issue featured actress Marilyn Monroe, which sold over 50,000 copies (SOURCE: [www.playboyenterprises.com/about/history/](http://www.playboyenterprises.com/about/history/)).
